Why transition planning?

Defined in IDEA: The term "transition services" means a coordinated set of activities for a child with a disability that: (34 CFR 300 43(a) 120 U.S.C. 1401 (34) within a results-oriented process, that is focused on improving the academic and functional achievement of the child with a disability to facilitate the child's movement from school to post-school activities:

- Including post-secondary <u>education</u>, vocational education, integrated <u>employment</u> (including supported employment), continuing and adult education, adult services, <u>independent living</u>, or community participation;
- Is based on the individual child's needs, taking into account the child's <u>strengths</u>, <u>preferences</u>, <u>and interests</u>; and
- Includes <u>instruction</u>, <u>related services</u>, <u>community experiences</u>, the development of employment and other <u>post-school adult living objectives</u>, and, if appropriate, acquisition of daily living skills and functional vocational evaluation.
- To the extent appropriate, with the consent of the parents or child who has reached the age of majority, the public agency must invite a representative of any participating agency that is likely to be responsible for providing or paying for transition services. (34 CFR 300.321(b)(3))



- Begin not later than the first IEP to be in effect when the child turns 16, or younger if determined by the IEP Team
- Updated annually
- Measurable post-secondary goals based upon age appropriate assessments related to training, education, employment, and where appropriate, independent living skills
- Transition services (including the course of study)
 needed to help the child in reaching those goals.

Transition services



CA State Performance Plan Indicator 13: 8 elements

- 1. Are there appropriate measurable post-secondary goals in the areas of education & training, employment, and as needed, independent living skills?
- 2. Are the post-secondary goals updated annually?
- 3. Is there evidence that the measurable post-secondary goal(s) were based on age-appropriate transition assessment?
- 4. Are there transition services in the IEP that will reasonably enable the student to meet his/her postsecondary goal?
- 5. Do transition services include courses of study that will reasonably enable the student to meet his or her post-secondary goal(s)?
- 6. Is (are) there annual IEP goals related to the student's transition service needs?
- 7. Is there evidence that the student was invited to the IEP team meeting where transition services were discussed?
- 8. If appropriate, is there evidence that a representative of any participating agency was invited to the IEP team meeting with prior consent of the parent or student who has achieved the age of majority?
